


Urban League Twin Cities 2021 Update

The year 2021 undoubtedly will be remembered for its extraordinary challenges. The stubborn and destructive impact of the coronavirus; the attempted insurrection at the U.S. Capitol on January 6; the trials of killer cops Derek Chauvin and Kimberly Potter; and violent crime in Minneapolis and St. Paul soaring to near record levels amid calls and action to dismantle the police department and establish rent control.

The impact of these development on Black people also has been extraordinary. Black people experienced disproportionately high hospitalization and death rates from COVID as well as deep and stubborn vaccine hesitancy. Layoffs and job losses occurred at higher rates for Blacks. The year also included a surge in hate crimes and continued police shooting of unarmed Black men. As stakeholders, the Urban League has witnessed these events with deep personal connection and concern. As servants and leaders, we have rolled up our sleeves and gone to work. The result has been a year of striving and no small measure of success. Here are a few highlights:

- We launched ULTC's Center for Social Justice ("CSJ") and hired Cynthia Fraction as Director. CSJ will issue its first major research report at the end of this month. This State of Black Minnesota report is a comprehensive analysis of seven key metrics of well-being for African Descendants, including arts, business, criminal justice, education, faith, housing/generational wealth, and public health.
- ULTC is a subrecipient of major new grants from Google and Comcast to the National Urban League to expand its Urban Tech Jobs Program that is helping to close the digital divide with training to achieve industry recognized credentials. ULTC's workforce team initiated bi-monthly virtual job fairs in 2020 that have attracted over 60 employers and average more than 50 job seekers and attendees per fair.
- ULTC will publish this month the MN Equity in Action Framework, co-authored by Marquita Stephens, ULTC's VP for Strategic Engagement, along with partners from the MN Department of Education and Minneapolis Public Schools. The Framework promotes equitable power relationships for six drivers of education excellence that increase the likelihood of achievement for all students.
- One hundred percent of our housing counselors/coaches achieved HUD certification this past year. A grant from Wells Fargo provided funds to initiate a new homebuyer training curriculum and supports focused on individuals and couples interested in buying duplexes, triplexes or quads.
- REAL TALK, our virtual town hall forum launched in 2020, expanded to nine programs in 2021. Topics included white supremacy, the Chauvin murder trial, and Black voter suppression.
- ULTC's Young Professionals, an auxiliary organization of the National Urban League dedicated to bringing the next generation of leaders into the Urban League movement, was recognized this year with a regional PIVOT Award, which honors young professionals who make significant contributions to their local communities. Vachel Hudson, ULTC YP Chapter president was named YP President of the Year. Vachel also works for ULTC as Housing Manager.

We envision a future in which African descendants are fully engaged, empowered and invested in the success and well-being of the Twin Cities metro area. At ULTC, we show up every work day to help make that happen.

Steven Belton **President & Chief Executive Officer**

Steven Belton was appointed interim President and CEO of the Urban League Twin Cities (then the Minneapolis Urban League) in April 2015. After a national search, the Board appointed him to the permanent position in December of that year. An experienced executive and attorney, Belton has held positions in government, public schools, and the private and non-profit sectors. Immediately prior to joining ULTC, he served for several years as youth pastor for Park Avenue United Methodist Church, where he still serves as Minister of Preaching. Married for 40 years to Sharon Sayles Belton, former Mayor of Minneapolis, Steven and Sharon have three adult children.

Current Opportunities

Mentor

As a tutor, you'll provide high school students in our Black Gems program help with writing, English, math and more. Tutoring sessions are scheduled with each student individually during the school year. Background check required.

Guest Presenter

We're looking for experts in financial literacy, writing and storytelling, emotional intelligence and more. Experts will present on their area of expertise to students in our Black Gems program. Presenters will be asked to give 1-2 hours of their time per school year.



Family Day Event

As a Family Day volunteer, you can help bring entertainment, food, fun and resources to families in North Minneapolis. Volunteers can sign up for a three-hour time slot and will receive a free t-shirt to wear on the day of the event. Family Day is held in late August every year.

Unity Ball Event

Brandi Powell is a weekday Morning News Anchor and has been part of the 5 Eyewitness News team since January 2014.

In 2020, Brandi launched and reported an in-depth series called Conversations About Racism and the Road to Equality. The 3-part series included Understanding Racism, The Talk and Youth Activists & Education. Her team won a Minnesota Society of Professional Journalists Page One Award for Special Project/In-depth Series in 2021.

At KSTP-TV Brandi is also a daily contributor on Minnesota Live. She's filled-in as host on At Issue and as co-host on Twin Cities Live and Minnesota Live. Brandi was selected to be in the Prince and Mary Tyler Moore REELZ specials, giving on-air perspectives as a journalist and Minnesotan.

From 2011-2013, Brandi worked as a Reporter/Multi-Media Journalist at KNSD-TV (NBC 7) in San Diego. She covered breaking news, crime and politics. She also served as a regular on-air contributor for Politically Speaking, the station's weekly political show.

Brandi worked as a Reporter/Video Journalist/Bell County Bureau Chief, from 2008-2009, at News 8 Austin (now Spectrum News -Time Warner Cable). She covered Fort Hood and its surrounding communities.

Her first on-air TV position was as the Political Reporter at KFYR-TV (NBC Affiliate) in Bismarck, North Dakota. From 2006-2008, she covered statewide elections and legislative sessions. Brandi was on assignment in Guatemala for nearly two weeks, covering elections, agriculture and education as she followed a group of North Dakota teachers doing an intercultural exchange.

Brandi began her career, behind-the-scenes, as a Production Assistant at MSNBC, from 2005-2006. She was an Intern with The Washington Center, for the 2004 Republican National Convention in New York City. She was also an Intern with Dateline NBC in 2004.

INVOCATION IMAM MAKRAM EL-AMIN

Imam Makram El-Amin's commitment to service and civic leadership has made him a pillar in the Minneapolis community. For more than two decades, his work as a religious and community leader has been firmly rooted in the principle of our inherent human dignity. In addition to his weekly teaching duties, Imam El-Amin leads Al Maa'uun (Neighborly Needs) Community Outreach Services (almaauun.org) that addresses food insecurity, affordable housing, career services, and mentoring.



The 30th attorney general of Minnesota. A member of the Democratic–Farmer–Labor Party (DFL), Ellison was the U.S. representative for Minnesota's 5th congressional district from 2007 to 2019. He also served as the titular deputy chair of the Democratic National Committee from 2017 to 2018.

In Congress, Ellison was a vicechair of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and a Chief Deputy Whip. He was the first African American representative from Minnesota.

Ellison's profile was raised when he joined the race for chair of the Democratic National Committee in November 2016, gaining support from progressive groups and U.S. senators Bernie Sanders (of Vermont) and Chuck Schumer (of New York).







PBS White House Correspondent NBC/MSNBC Political Contributor

KEYNOTE YAMICHE ALCINDOR

Currently the White House correspondent for PBS NewsHour, she moves to NBC News in March of 2022 as their Washington correspondent covering the Biden administration, the impact of federal policies on communities and issues at the intersection of race, culture, and politics.

She is also moderator and anchor for PBS' Washington Week, a role she will continue in after her move to NBC. A long-time MSNBC and NBC political contributor on programs such as Meet the Press, Morning Joe, Andrea Mitchell Reports, and Deadline, Yamiche Alcindor has become a goto voice in analyzing the most critical issues of our time.

A broadcast journalist who came up through the ranks of print journalism, she worked as a national reporter for The New York Times and USA Today.

She has been called "a powerhouse," "relentless" in the pursuit of truth, and courageous in her ability to "speak truth to power."


Relentless & Unapologetic 2021

As a published author, he has written such books as Politically Considered: Commemoration of the Supreme Court Decision of 1954 and The Hiptionary: A Survey of African American Speech Patterns with Critical Commentary and A Digest of Key Words and Phrases and his latest Haiti: The Hidden Truth.


